St Brigid's Crossley Port Fairy Spring Music Festival

Secondary and upper primary students (Years 5 & 6) are invited to take part in three exciting performances of 'Bell Curve' at the beautiful St Brigid's Church Crossley as part of the 2022 Port Fairy Spring Music Festival.



Twelve young musicians will be spread throughout St Brigid's, performing on Victoria's beautiful Federation Handbells. Through the use of click track technology and complex networked temporal relationships, they move seamlessly in and out of sync from stunningly complex rhythms to perfect unisons. A massed sound event unfolds across the performance space, a world revealed between the attacks and beating patterns of tuned bell resonance.

Students will work closely with Speak Percussion Artists Kaylie Melville (percussion) and Jem Savage (electronics) to learn this captivating work. Main rehearsals will be held over two days in the school holidays (September 29-30), with short revision rehearsals to be held on October 13-14 ahead of three public performances on Saturday October 15.
