
SPEAK PERCUSSION SOUNDS UNHEARD

Victorian secondary students are invited to take part in the premiere performance of a new musical work from Speak Percussion. Premiering in the Science Gallery's Dark Matters exhibition, Dark Voyages draws inspiration from the Voyager space expedition and the story of the Golden Record.

The Golden Record is a curated set of images and sounds, portraying life on Earth and greeting any other potential residents of the universe. Launched into space in 1977, the Voyager spacecraft and the Golden Record are now the farthest human-made objects from Earth.

Dark Voyages is a new musical work exploring the story of the Golden Record, using percussion and artificial intelligence to synthesise the record's sounds and new sounds from the modern day into a new cosmic language.

Led by Speak Percussion's Assistant Artistic Director Kaylie Melville, students will rehearse and premiere this exciting new work at the Science Gallery's November Friday Night Social: a curated evening of musical performances presented alongside the Dark Matters exhibition, exploring the fundamental essence and mysteries of the universe.

Participants will perform on a range of traditional and non-traditional percussion instruments. Percussionists and non-percussionists are encouraged to apply, and all materials will be provided.
